Maria Eriksson Baaz is Professor of International Relations at the Department of Government, Uppsala University, Sweden. Her research interests span over critical security and military studies, research ethics, post-colonial theory and conflict related sexual violence (CRSV). Her research on CRSV initially focused on perpetrators of violence and military organizations and more lately on developing a better understanding of the immense variation of CRSV as well as the continuum of sexual violence along the war and peace continuum.

She is the co-author (with Maria Stern) of *Sexual Violence as a Weapon of War? Perceptions, Prescriptions, Problems in the Congo and Beyond* (Zed Books, 2013) as well as several articles on the topic. Her current research interests involve understanding research contributions by facilitating researchers in insecure zones, and breaking down the war/peace dichotomy, particularly in relation to researching sexual violence.
