Papa don't Preach: Familial Ethics and Fatherhood in Seneca

Liz Gloyn is a Reader in Latin Languages and Literature in the Department of Classics at Royal Holloway.

In this talk, Liz will explore what the Roman Stoic philosopher Seneca had to say about fatherhood, in both his prose and tragedies. She will explain how he balances a counter-cultural vision of the father-son relationship with critique of Roman expectations of familial relationships.

Liz has recently been interviewed on Radio 4's Women's Hour and frequently appears as a quest interviewee on podcasts.
